The committee met for the purpose of reviewing NFHS playing rules, MHSAA Regulations and Tournament procedures/policies concerning High School Football. Following is a review of items discussed by the committee as well as recommendations to MHSAA staff and for possible Representative Council consideration.

Calendar

MHSAA staff provided the committee a six-year calendar demonstrating the earliest practice date, the earliest game date and the number of contests prior to Labor Day. For 2014 season, the earliest practice date is August 11, and the earliest game date is August 28 allowing for one scheduled contests prior to Labor Day.

Tournament Review

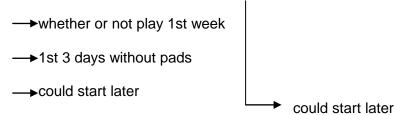
The committee was provided 2013 Football Playoff Tournament information for both the 11-player format and the 8-player format, with statistical data for all levels of tournament competition. The data demonstrated consistency with previous years under the current format when comparing school classification, division enrollment breaks and the numbers of automatic qualifiers.

In 2011, 2012 and 2013, there were 234, 237 and 225 schools, respectively, which qualified automatically based on regular season records. In 2013 there were 44 games that were subject to the "Point Differential" procedure.

Monday, August 11 - First allowable day of 3 day of conditioning period (no pads). Subject to change.

Thursday, August 15 - First date of official practice (with pads) (if 3 days of conditioning were completed during the week).

Thursday, August 23 - First varsity game date.

- Schools may not conduct inter school scrimmages until after nine separate days of practice.
- Interscholastic games (all levels) cannot be played until teams have completed 12 separate days of practice over a 3-week period.

8-Player Football

To date there are 29 schools projected to participate in the 8-Player format for 2014.

Health & Safety Issues

The committee was presented with information and discussed the recommendations made by the Football Task Force and was in agreement with the proposals being advanced to the Representative Council.

The proposals are as follows:

- 1. During the first week of practice of the season, only helmets are allowed the first two days, only shoulder pads may be added on the third and fourth days, and full pads may not be worn until the fifth day of team practice.
- 2. Before the first regular season game, schools may not schedule more than one "collision" practice in a day.
 - A "collision" practice is one in which there is live, game-speed, player-vs.-player contact in pads (not walk-throughs) involving any number of players. This includes practices with scrimmages, drills and simulations where action is live, game-speed, player-vs.-player.
 - If any part of a drill or scrimmage involves live game-speed player-vs.-player contact in pads, it is a collision practice even if players do not execute full tackles at a competitive pace that takes players to the ground.
 - During any additional practice sessions that day, players may wear helmets and other pads (neither is mandatory). Blocking and tackling technique may be taught and practiced. However, full-speed contact is limited to players vs. pads, shields, sleds or dummies.
- 3. After the first regular season game, teams may conduct no more than two collision practice days in any week, Monday through Sunday. During other days of practice, players may wear helmets and other protective pads (neither is mandatory). Blocking and tackling technique may be taught and practiced. However, full-speed contact is limited to players vs. pads, shields, sleds or dummies.
- 4. No single practice may exceed three hours, and the total practice time for days with multiple practice sessions may not exceed five hours.
 - Warm-up, stretching, speed and agility drills and cool down are all considered part
 of practice. Neither strength/weight training activities nor video/classroom sessions
 are considered practice for the purposes of the three- or five-hour limits.

The committee also reviewed the latest printing of the Football Preseason Guide which will be updated prior to the fall season and will contain the following:

Junior High/Middle School

- 1. The committee supports the current season limits for football contest.
- 2. The committee supports the overall governance of 6th grade students by the MHSAA but not allowing 6th grade to participate with 7th and 8th graders in football.

Recommendations to Representative Council

- 1. Approve the recommendation by the Junior High/Middle School Committees recommendation to increase the length of quarters from 8 minutes to a maximum of 10 minutes.
- 2. Sub-varsity contest given the extended length today's contest the committee recommends for changing the timing of 9th grade/junior varsity contest so that following a change of possession the clock will start on the ready for play signal, rather than on the snap. (19-0 in favor)
- 3. Starting with the 2014 Football Playoffs assign 7-person officiating crews for all Semifinal and Final contests. This would add two "deep" positions of the field judge and side judge to our current crews (Referee, Linesman, Line Judge, and Back Judge). (19-0 in favor)
- 4. Approve the proposal for a tournament format that utilizes the strength of schedule with enhanced playoff and bonus points which identifies eight division prior to the start of the season and (new) does not include an automatic qualifier component (seven wins). Teams would qualify based strictly on points. This proposal is different from the previous in that the automatic qualifier component (7 wins) is removed. (11-3 in favor)
