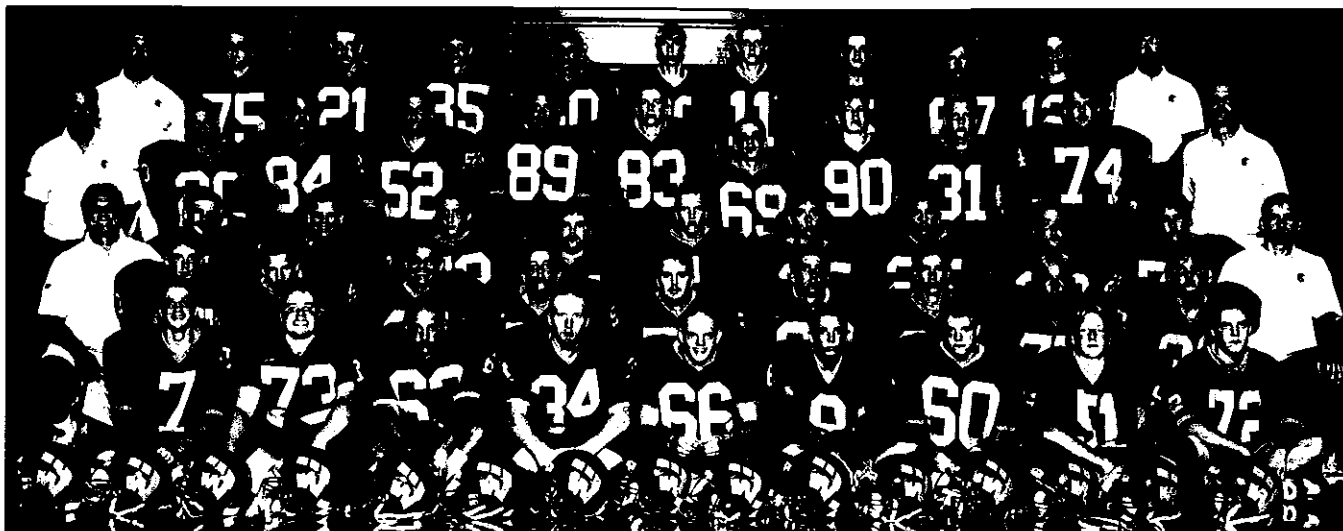

FINAL GAME NOTES — Freshman Lehotan ended the game in the second overtime with his field goal after Lapeer West stopped South Lyon on downs on its possession of second overtime. Each team scored on their second play from scrimmage in the first overtime period. Despite having a touchdown called back on penalty early in the game, South Lyon scored first on McGuire's punt return, which was a Class A Finals record. After Lapeer West tied the game, the Lions recovered a Kenny Yelle fumble and cashed it in on Watson's run for a 14-7 halftime lead. Lapeer West sent the game into overtime on Dreyer's second score capping an 80-yard drive. Watson set a Class A Finals record with 30 carries.
