

# **Boys Soccer**

## Flint Powers Wins First Soccer Title In Overtime

Jeff Angle scored 65 seconds into the second overtime to give Flint Powers (19-3-2) its first boys soccer MHSAA championship 1-0 over Marshall.

Adam Sabin set up Angle, who beat Marshall sophomore goalkeeper Sean Duffy early in the second overtime after a tightly contested match which yielded few scoring chances.

"That is the biggest goal he will probably ever think of in his life," Powers Coach Kevin Fiebernitz said. "He ended his career in great fashion."

Marshall outshot Powers 20-19 and had fewer fouls, 13-14, but was unable to breakthrough against Powers goalie Nick Thomas. Thomas made 11 saves in the contest while Duffy stopped 10 shots from Powers.

It was the first appearance in the finals for either school.

Marshall ended its season at 21-4.
