WILD D4 FINAL SETS RECORDS

As if 107 combined points weren't enough, the 2021 MHSAA Division 4 Final will be remembered as the biggest comeback in championship history, as Chelsea overcame a three-score deficit in the fourth quarter for the school's first title.

Lucas Dunn just wanted to get the snap down. After throwing an MHSAA Finals-record six touchdown passes, the Chelsea quarterback would only have the ball in his hands momentarily on the final play of the game. But he knew if he handled his split-second duties, his friend Hunter Shaw would handle the rest.

"Just get it down," Dunn said. "It was a shaky snap, but we practice special teams probably more than anybody in the state. We pride ourselves on it, and it's come up big for us this postseason, and it showed there.

"(Shaw) is my dude, he's one of my best friends, I love the dude. I have all the confidence in the world with him. He's a competitor, he's confident, he's composed, and he deserved that."

Dunn handled the snap and Shaw drilled a 33-yard field goal to give the Bulldogs a 55-52 victory against Hudsonville Unity Christian in the dramatic 2021 Division 4 championship game at Ford Field.

"I just was like, 'We're state champs,'" Shaw said. "Obviously this team (Unity Christian) set the state record for most points (in a season), they're a great team. Our defense showed up at the end, and we came back and won it. We're state champs."

The Bulldogs (14-0) trailed by three scores in the fourth quarter, but came all the way back to claim their first Finals title in a game that saw multiple MHSAA 11-player championship game records fall. Five of Dunn's touchdown passes went to Lucas Hanifan, setting a record for receiving scores in a Finals game. The combined score snapped the record for combined points set by New Lothrop and Madison Heights Madison in 2018 (New Lothrop won that Division 7 Final, 50-44). Chelsea's 55 points were one away from tying the record for a single team in a Finals game, and Unity Christian's total ended up fifth all-time.

"It was ugly there, but you know what, we continue to fight every week," Chelsea coach Josh Lucas said. "We never, ever quit, and that's what tonight is about. It's a high school game, you've got 16, 17, 18-

year old kids, and no one wanted to win the game at the end – we turned it over, they turned over. Hats off to those guys, they're a great team, but tonight the 'Dogs are a little bit better, so we're excited to be state champs. We're going to have that trophy for one year, and that's how we're going to celebrate, for one whole year."

Chelsea trailed 52-31 early in the fourth quarter, as Cameron Chandler scored his third rushing touchdown of the game for Unity Christian.

The Bulldogs responded with three touchdown passes from Dunn to Hanifan (21, 29 and 16 yards), with the last one coming with 4:43 to play after Braden Watson had recovered a fumble on the Unity Christian 19-yard line.

"It's been a wild ride, just so many emotions," Dunn said. "I lost my grandma a week and a half ago, right before the Country Day (Regional Final), and she was looking over me tonight."

From there, the teams traded three turnovers, with Watson recovering another

fumble with 2:23 to play, Drew Chandler getting the ball back with an interception with 1:11 to play, and Regan Plank giving the ball to Chelsea for good by recovering a fumble with 46 seconds on the clock at the Unity Christian 35.

Three plays later, Chelsea set the ball up in the middle of the field and let the clock run down to three seconds to give Shaw a chance to end it with one kick.

"Peashooter," Lucas said. "He's a straight dog. He's done that all year. I think he's got two misses all year, and those are on bad snaps or bad holds. He hadn't missed one all year, so I knew if we got to the 20, 25, he had a chance to make it in. He's a dog, man. That's what dogs do, they step up when the big plays come."

Unity Christian's (13-1) uptempo straight-T offense was unstoppable all season, and it remained that way through three quarters Friday. It finished with 803 points on the year, breaking the 11-player record of 774 set in 1999 by Muskegon Orchard View.

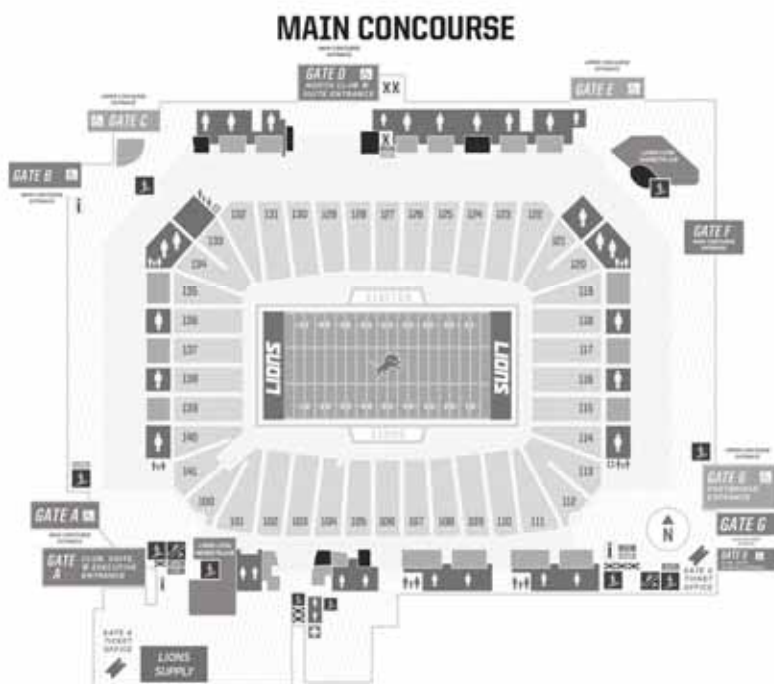

ALL DE LA SALLE IN D2 FINAL

Rhett Roeser and his Warren De La Salle Collegiate teammates weren't fond of the feeling they walked away with in 2020 following the MHSAA Division 2 Football Final.

They acted in quick and ruthless fashion a year later to make sure history didn't repeat itself.

Led by junior quarterback Brady Drogosh's four touchdowns and 316 total yards, the Pilots cruised to a 41-14 victory against Traverse City Central at Ford Field, claiming the school's fourth Finals title.

"This is a great feeling," said Roeser, a sophomore running back. "This is what we've been working for and what we've been striving for. After we lost last year, we knew we were going to be in the same place and we were going to be on the other side of this one."

The Pilots responded with the first unbeaten season in school history, and first title since 2018.

"We had high expectations for this group and the program," De La Salle coach Dan Rohn said. "We lost last year in the Finals, and it kind of left a little mark on us. We kind of weren't ready, and that was a great Shores team; they did some great things. Playing Traverse City Central and getting the opportunity to come back here and compete at the highest level, that was important. But our goal was not to get here, it was to win it."

De La Salle controlled the game from the outset with a suffocating defense and a balanced offense. Traverse City Central was held to 31 total yards in the first half, and gained 100 of its 149 yards for the game on a pair of drives in the fourth quarter after De La Salle had built a 41-0 lead.

"Coming in they averaged 50-some points per game, so we knew we had to get off to a good start and punch them in the mouth from the beginning," said De La Salle senior linebacker Will Beesley, who led the team with eight tackles. "Our motto this week was bring the wood, be the most physical team on every play, and I feel like we did that today."

Drogosh had accumulated a solid game's worth of stats by the time the first half ended. He was 14-of-17 passing for 142 yards and three touchdowns, and he added 128 yards on the ground, including a 45-yard touchdown. He didn't add to his passing total in the second half, but finished the game with 174 yards on the ground.

The Pilots (13-0) scored on all five of their possessions in the first half, and dominated the time of possession, holding the ball for 17 minutes, 11 seconds and putting together three drives that lasted more than five minutes apiece.

Josh Burnham put the Trojans (12-2) on the board midway through the fourth quarter with a 5-yard touchdown run. Joshua Klug scored on a 24-yard run with 1:28 to play.

BELLEVILLE GETS 1ST CROWN

Belleville's football team found Ford Field after a series of near-misses in recent seasons. The Tigers found it much to their liking, too.

Belleville put its speed, athleticism and depth of talent on full display in a 55-33 runaway victory over Rochester Adams in the 2021 MHSAA Division 1 title game. The fast track and climate-controlled environment were ideal in the Tigers' first-ever Finals appearance.

Freshman quarterback Bryce Underwood passed for 284 yards and five touchdowns with no interceptions, three of the scores to senior Jeremiah Caldwell as the Tigers (13-1) came within a point of tying a record for most scored in a Finals game.

Underwood finished 12-of-21 passing. He capped Belleville's scoring with a 30-yard run in the fourth quarter when he delivered a forceful stiff-arm in the backfield to a would-be tackler.

The 6-3, 175-pound Caldwell was on the receiving end of only four passes, but the playmaker converted them into a whopping 204 yards. Underwood connected with the lanky, speedy senior on scoring strikes of 56, 64 and 72 yards, all in

the first half, as Belleville took a 21-20 edge.

Belleville took control in the third quarter, when the Tigers converted two

Adams turnovers into touchdowns – one on a blocked punt and the other on a fumble recovery. They led 35-20 entering the fourth quarter, and that margin never dipped below 14 points.

Six different players scored TDs for Belleville, illustrating Crowell's point in the postgame press conference that it was a team effort. The Tigers had no turnovers.

Even though Belleville's defense surrendered 33 points, the Tigers made enough plays on that side of the ball and they did it with several players contributing.

Seniors Cameron Dyson and JaShawn Greene led Belleville's defense with eight tackles apiece. Greene also had a forced fumble and sack, while Caldwell picked off a pass.

Adams (13-1), which went unscathed through the rugged Oakland Activities Association as well as a challenging playoff road, made some plays on Saturday, too.

Senior QB Parker Picot completed 8 of 21 passes for three TDs, four of his completions going to 6-6, 215-pound sophomore Brady Prieskorn for 117 yards and two scores.

Adams was seeking its first state title since 2003, which was Patriotto's first season at the helm, when the Highlanders captured the Division 2 championship.

PIVOTAL PLAYMAKING LEADS KING TO D3 TITLE

Past disappointments tucked away in his mind, Dante Moore knew what he needed to do with an elusive Finals title on the line in 2021 at Ford Field.

Detroit Martin Luther King's junior quarterback needed to make a play to put the game away. And that's exactly what he and senior receiver Chansey Willis Jr. did.

Pinned against their own goal line, Moore and Willis converted a big third-down play to seal King's 25-21 victory over defending Division 3 champion DeWitt in a hard-fought title game.

It was the first Finals championship for Moore. Facing 3rd-and-6 from his own 5 and with his team holding a four-point lead, Moore hit Willis on a 7-yard play to move the chains and enable the Crusaders (13-1) to run out the clock.

Moments earlier, King's defense stuffed DeWitt (12-2) on 4th-and-goal from the 1 in the back-and-forth contest.

"I just say, 'Hey,' I looked at Chansey – how we've been all year – 'I'll lead my guy, let's get this pass. They don't have any more timeouts. We can win this game,'" Moore said. "I gave him my trust throwing him the ball, and he's going to catch the ball, get down and get the first down."

The championship was King's first since 2018 and fourth in seven years.

During Moore's freshman year in 2019, King lost to Muskegon Mona Shores, 35-26, in the Division 2 Final. The Crusaders fell in the 2021 Regional to River Rouge, which lost a 40-30 shootout to DeWitt in the Division 3 championship game.

"Blessings. Ever since we lost my freshman year to Mona Shores, a shot at that great team; last year we lost to River Rouge. I mean, we've been hungry," said Moore, who finished 18-of-24 passing for 228 yards with an interception.

King played like it early. The Crusaders scored in the game's first minute, as senior Terrence Brown sprinted for a 51-yard touchdown run. They made it 13-0 just 1:18 into the second quarter when junior defensive end Kenny Merrieweather tipped a pass and turned it into a 45-yard pick-six.

That was the start of a wild quarter when the teams combined for 33 points. Despite trailing 19-7 with three minutes left in the

half, DeWitt stormed back to take a 21-19 lead into the break.

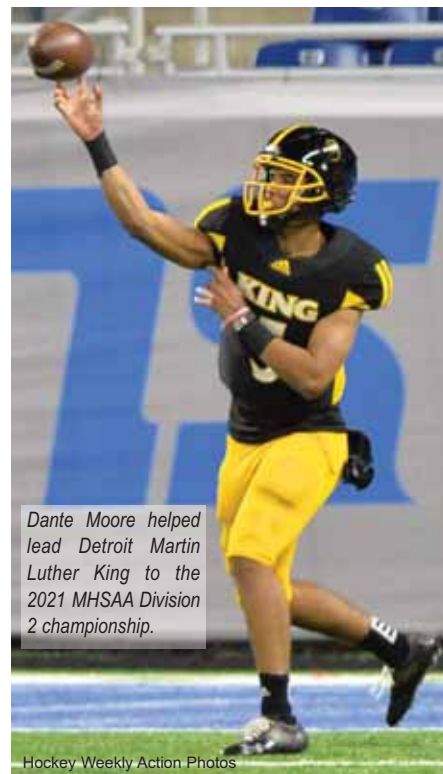
Senior QB Ty Holtz sandwiched 6- and 15-yard TD passes to seniors Bryce DeBri and Tommy McIntosh around a 6-yard scoring run by King's Brown. Then, in the closing seconds of the half, Holtz electrified the DeWitt crowd by intercepting Moore and returning it 69 yards for a TD.

It was a lead the Panthers held until Sterling Anderson Jr. scored on a 3-yard run with 8:22 remaining in the game to put the Crusaders back in front, 25-21.

Holtz finished 10-of-18 for 153 yards with two picks. Six of his completions went to McIntosh, who finished with 90 receiving yards.

Holtz guided DeWitt deep into King territory during the game's final minutes, as the Panthers had 1st-and-goal from the 10, but they could not punch it in.

Brown led all rushers with 113 yards on 11 carries. Willis caught four passes for 111 yards. Senior Blake Bailiff led King with 10 tackles, including stops on each of DeWitt's final four offensive plays.

HUDSON RIDES DOMINATING DEFENSE TO LOCK DOWN DIVISION 8

For a team not used to giving up points – or yards, for that matter – it would have been easy for Hudson to make some big changes at halftime to slow down a Beal City offense that had found success through the passing game.

But the Tigers – who entered the 2021 MHSAA Division 8 Final having allowed 107.7 yards and less than a touchdown per game through the Semifinals – didn't stray from the gameplan.

"Honestly, (the adjustment was) just keep playing," Hudson coach Dan Rogers said. "They did a great job, their line, we couldn't get pressure on the quarterback. We were trying to get to the quarterback a little bit more, keep the receivers in front of us and make plays on the football."

It worked, as Hudson smothered Beal City in the second half, allowing just 17 yards over the final 24 minutes of its 14-7 victory at Ford Field to claim its second Finals title.

"I can't even describe it yet; it hasn't really hit me yet," said Hudson senior running back and safety Bronson Marry, who had a crucial late-game interception. "I'm just waiting to walk out of the locker room and find our families. It's going to hit like a brick wall."

While Hudson (14-0) never led by more than one score, Beal City never threatened to overcome it, spending the entirety of the second half offensively on its own side of the field. The Aggies' five second-half possessions went for 4, -6, 13, 1 and 5 yards.

A fumble, an interception and downs ended the last three drives, with Nick Kopin breaking up the final Beal City pass attempt with 1:51 to play, sealing the game. It was a fitting end to Kopin's big day, as he also had forced a fumble earlier in the fourth quarter and rushed for 131 yards and both of Hudson's touchdowns.

Kopin's second score, a 2-yard run, came with 6:58 to play and put the Tigers up 14-7. The two-point pass was no good, however, keeping Beal City within a touchdown.

The Aggies received a further boost with the return of quarterback Hunter Miles, who had been injured midway through the third quarter, but Hudson's defense didn't allow for a storybook comeback.

Miles had more success in the first half, mostly on the strength of a pair of big pass plays to Carter Fussman. The first was a 53-yard touchdown pass late in the first quarter. Miles rolled to his right before finding Fussman open near the 10-yard line.

QB INTO THE SPOTLIGHT

To the casual observer, Grand Rapids Catholic Central's fifth MHSAA football title in six years may seem a little ho-hum.

Don't tell that to **John Passinaut** (left). This one was special – way different than what he may have envisioned at the start of the season.



The senior quarterback connected with Nolan Ziegler on a pair of second-half touchdown passes, and the GRCC defense did the rest in a 31-7 victory over Marine City in the 2021 Division 5 Final at Ford Field.

Joey Silveri, GRCC's three-year starting QB, suffered a season-ending knee injury in Week 4. That's when Passinaut, a 6-foot, 180-pound converted receiver, switched to the signal-caller position. Passinaut picked up where Silveri left off and helped lead the

Cougars to a second-straight Division 5 title, their sixth championship in the last dozen years and seventh overall.

"Well, it's surreal. Before the season, if you would have told me this was going to happen, I would have told you you're crazy," said Passinaut, who finished the game 15-of-28 passing for 221 yards with one interception.

GRCC (14-0) completed its third perfect season in the last five years, but Marine City (13-1) made the Cougars work for it for the better part of three quarters.

GRCC led 10-0 in the second quarter after a 29-yard field goal by junior John Meyer and a 2-yard TD run by Rellinger, a senior. Marine City hung in there, however, and pulled within 10-7 on junior QB Jeff Heaslip's 3-yard scoring pass to senior Charles Tigert with a little more than three minutes left in the half.

The score remained that way until the closing seconds of the third quarter. Ziegler, a 6-4, 210-pound receiver and linebacker, caught a pass over the middle from Passinaut, turned the corner and raced down the sideline for a 59-yard scoring play.

That seemed to ignite the Cougars' offense a bit.

The Passinaut-to-Ziegler connection struck again four minutes later, this time on a 17-yard TD play, as the Cougars began to pull away.

BIG PLAYS SPARK COUGARS

The Lansing Catholic defense spent the postseason nearing its peak performance. In the 2021 MHSAA Division 6 Football Final, the Cougars reached it.

They forced five turnovers and shut down a powerful Warren Michigan Collegiate run game in a 16-6 victory at Ford Field.

"Our defense is just something special. It's a true brotherhood," Lansing Catholic senior linebacker Mason Knippen said. "We just really started clicking as the playoffs started. Going into the season, we wanted to be a physical defense."

The title was the third for Lansing Catholic (13-1), and second in three years, as it won Division 5 in 2019.

"It's awful special, but credit (former coach) Jim Ahern for bringing in this system, and credit these guys – these guys are all like my sons," said first-year Lansing Catholic coach Jim Baker, whose son Joey was the team's starting quarterback.



To win title No. 3, Lansing Catholic needed to hold off a suddenly explosive Michigan Collegiate (11-3) passing game in the fourth quarter, and it did so with big plays of its own. Four of the final five Michigan Collegiate drives ended with a turnover, as Brandon Lewis, Dan Shipman and Knippen each had an interception, and Jack Jacobs forced and recovered a fumble. Knippen's interception sealed the victory with 1:36 remaining in the game.

Lansing Catholic gave up only 40 points, or eight per game, during its playoff run.

Owen Biergens led the Lansing Catholic defense with 11 tackles, while Knippen had eight. Baker finished with 181 yards on 17 of 39 passing. Senior Alex Watters caught six passes for 78 yards, and Biergens caught seven for 69.

P-W RAISES D7 TITLE BANNER

The 11 on the field for Pewamo-Westphalia's football team may have looked different at any given time this season because of mounting injuries, but no worries for the Pirates.

They just kept playing. Consequently, they continue to add MHSAA Finals hardware to the trophy case.

In a defensive battle of unbeaten and mirror images, senior **Dak Ewalt's** (right) 35-yard touchdown burst with 5:50 remaining lifted perennial power P-W to a 14-10 victory over first-time Finals qualifier Lawton in the 2021 MHSAA Division 7 title game at Ford Field. It was the fourth title in six years for the Pirates.

"Just the resiliency that this group had. There were so many times this year when we could have broke, but they just seemed to get stronger," said P-W coach Jeremy Miller, who improved to 105-9 in nine seasons at the helm.

P-W capped its third 14-0 season in six years. The Pirates added to their trophy case, which already features awards from 2016, 2017 and 2019 championships, plus runner-up finishes in 2011 and 2015.

It definitely wasn't easy this season, however. A number of key players missed significant time with injuries. For example, Ewalt was sidelined by a broken arm at the start of the season and missed the 28-21 Semifinal victory over Traverse City St. Francis because of a concussion.

When the speedy 5-foot-9, 180-pound Ewalt got the call in the Final, he was ready.

After Lawton (13-1) took a 10-7 lead in the hard-fought game on senior Ethan O'Donnell's 43-yard field goal with 10:06 left – the fifth-longest field goal in 11-Player Finals history – Ewalt and the Pirates answered. He took a dive handoff and sprinted untouched for what proved to be the winning TD.

Sportsmanship Extends to Online Behavior

With the changes that have occurred in college sports the past couple of years, high school sports is truly the last level of pure amateur competition in our country – and the NFHS and its member state associations want it to remain that way.

As football, volleyball, soccer, cross country and other sports begin this fall, high school coaches and athletic/activity directors will be involved in preseason meetings to emphasize the expected outcomes of education-based sports, as well as speech, debate, music, theatre and other programs.

Among those fundamental values of education-based activities that must be discussed is sportsmanship, or good sporting behavior. More than winning, more than learning the skills of a sport, a focus on sportsmanship has been one of the defining elements of high school sports and other activities for more than 100 years.

Along with maintaining the sound traditions of sports and minimizing the risk of injury, NFHS playing rules encourage sportsmanship, and the first page in all NFHS rules publications includes a statement noting that “each athlete is responsible for exercising caution and good sportsmanship.”

In the past, with an emphasis on conduct on the playing field or court – or in the auditorium or rehearsal hall – sportsmanship has been defined as those qualities of behavior that are characterized by generosity and genuine concern for others. More so than preparing students to play sports or another activity at the next level, one of the significant goals of education-based high school sports and activities is helping the 12 million-plus individuals in these programs to become responsible citizens.

And in today’s online world dominated by hand-held devices, that goal has become more challenging. Now, messages to students in high school sports and other activities about sportsmanship must be communicated before they hit the practice field or court because one inappropriate post, tweet or message could alter their lives forever.

At the recent virtual National Student Leadership Summit hosted by the NFHS, Christina Jontra of Neptune Navigate, one of the newest NFHS corporate partners, discussed the need for good sportsmanship online as much or more so than on the court or field.

In the digital age in which we live, participants in high school activity programs need to be aware that

their character and respect for others should be the same, whether in the sport or activity itself, or online.

As the popularity and influence of social media continues to surge, it is imperative that student-athletes, as well as coaches, administrators, parents and everyone involved in education-based athletics, are aware of the ways they can endanger themselves with their online behavior and understand the techniques they can employ to prevent that from happening.

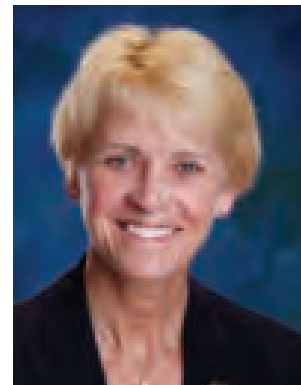
In her recent presentation, Jontra noted five characteristics of good sportsmanship online – honesty, compassion, respect, responsibility and courage. Just as a student would respect an opponent on the field or in the debate room, the same must occur online.

At preseason meetings this fall, coaches and athletic/activity directors should encourage students in their programs to be mindful of online contact with individuals on opposing teams – particularly any bantering that could be perceived as cyberbullying. As Jontra mentioned in her message during the NSLS, hurtful words can ruin a person’s life forever.

Fortunately, during the season, the millions of high school students involved in sports and performing arts have less free time to spend online on a daily basis, but the time spent must be done in a positive manner. Not only could damaging words on social media affect a student’s chances for an athletic scholarship, inappropriate messages could also negatively impact future job possibilities as employers are more actively auditing social media.

Whether the setting is before hundreds of people at an actual game or event, or a private experience alone online, positive and respectful behavior should be the choice every time.

Scholar-Athlete Award in 34th Year Awarding Scholarships to Students

Thousands of students voluntarily extend their classroom day by taking part in extracurricular activities, often improving their academic achievements in the process. The value that such programs play in the total education of a high school student is highlighted through the MHSAA/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award, which will award \$2,000 scholarships to 32 top student-athletes and recognize over 2,000 other outstanding individuals in 2022-23.

Underwritten by Farm Bureau Insurance, the Scholar-Athlete Award is now in its 34th year, and presents scholarships to students in every MHSAA enrollment classification. The scholarships may be used at any institution of higher learning.

“It is amazing to see the number of young people who are proven achievers in academics and activities,” said Mark Uyl, executive director of the MHSAA. “At a time when our educational system is coming under fire, the Scholar-Athlete

Award is something that proves how important athletics are to the development of a well-rounded person.”

Students applying for the Scholar-Athlete Award must be graduating during the 2022-23 school year, carry a 3.5 grade-point average, and have previously won a letter in a varsity sport that the MHSAA sponsors postseason competition.



Applicants will also be required to show involvement in other school-community activities and submit an essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Each MHSAA member school is allowed to nominate a number of student-athletes based on the size of the school. Class A schools can nominate six boys and six girls, Class B four boys and four girls, Class C three boys and three girls and Class D two boys and two girls. The first 30 scholarships will be awarded based on this graduated scale, with two additional scholarships intended for minority applicants.

A committee composed of school administrators from across the state will select regional and statewide winners.

The 32 scholarship recipients will be recognized at the MHSAA Boys Basketball Finals at the Breslin Student Events Center in East Lansing in March 2023.

Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

Eight student-athletes who will be juniors at their schools during the 2022-23 academic year have been selected to serve two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of Association championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2022-23 are: **Kannon Duffing**, Manchester; **Claire Gorno**, Gaylord; **M'Khi Guy**, Muskegon; **Dawson Lehw**, Marcellus; **Christian Sanders**, Detroit Renaissance; **Ben Sytsma**, Grand Rapids Christian; **Madeline Werner**, Bay City All Saints; and **DaNia Womack**, Dearborn Advanced Tech Academy.

Those eight new members were selected from 115 applicants. That applicant total was the second-most ever, with the last three years featuring the three highest totals.

The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 129 schools from 48 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in nine MHSAA sports, and seven will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets seven times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic athletics, the Council discusses issues dealing with the 4 S's of educational athletics: scholarship, sportsmanship, safety (including health and nutrition) and the sensible scope of athletic

We believe **officials** commit their own time to high school sports and respect should always be shown and given to them.*

The MHSAA Representative Council

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, nonpublic schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.
