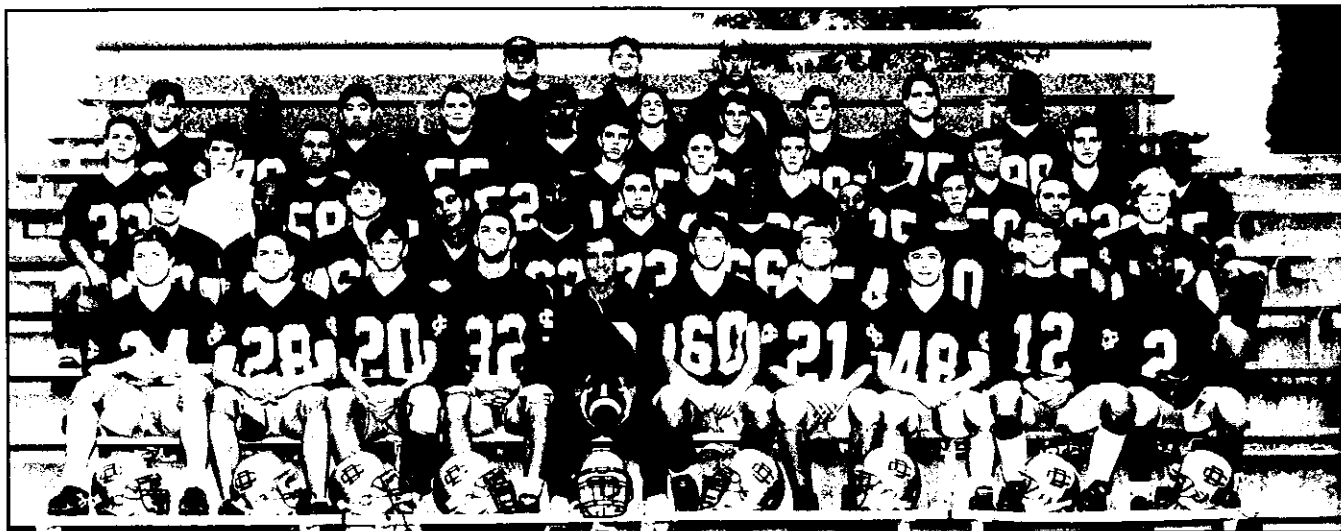

FINAL GAME NOTES — Country Day's balanced attack and tough defense overcame a Class B final record tying 70 yards in penalties. Collins one-yard plunge on the opening drive gave the Yellowjackets the lead for good. Following a Country Day fumble, Orchard View had a chance to tie the game but was stopped on fourth and goal from the one. Country Day answered with a 97-yard scoring drive and a two-touchdown lead. A minute later, Inmland scooped up an Orchard View fumble and rumbled 42 yards and a 21-0 lead. The fumble return was a Class B final record. Orchard View mounted a second-half comeback but with no yards passing (finals record tying mark), it was too much to overcome.
